Itinerary

Elephants in Kruger Region

DAY 1: Arrive in Johannesburg, SA

Welcome to South Africa and the start of your African Adventure. Arrive Johannesburg this evening, transfer to your hotel for the night.

DAY 2: Johannesburg

Wake up refreshed and ready to start the day! You have free time to explore the area on your own or take in an optional tour. This evening enjoy a welcome dinner & tour briefing with your fellow travellers.

DAY 3: Johannesburg

This morning, take a trip through the township of Soweto, the heartland of the movement that freed South Africa from apartheid. Explore it the sensitive way, with a local guide. Learn about Nelson Mandela and Desmond Tutu on the street where they both lived, hear about activist Hector Peterson's life and death, and more with visits to the Hector Peterson Memorial and Apartheid Museum. Lunch is included today.

DAY 4: Kruger Region

Travel overland to Limpopo Province which offers some of the best attractions for visitors to South Africa. Home to many top tier nature reserves. A land of exquisite sights sounds and tastes, from glorious sunsets over Kruger National Park to delicious wine and dining. The Limpopo

province borders Botswana, Zimbabwe and Mozambique making it a place where African culture, cuisine and landscape merge to give one an excellent taste of what Africa has to offer. Our camp for the next 4 nights combines the warmth and vibrancy of a safari, exuding a true feeling of being in a bygone era. Overlooking the Makhutsi River, tucked deep in the Big Five Karongwe Game Reserve, offering an unrivalled African Safari experience where the warm atmosphere, friendly staff and fine cuisine compliment the excellent Big 5 game viewing. Enjoy early morning and late afternoon safaris in open 4x4 safari vehicles conducted by experienced guides and trackers. When not out on safari searching for the Big 5, you have time to relax at the pool or retire to one of the beautifully decorated lounges.

DAY 5-7: Kruger Region

A game-rich area, you can expect to see the Big 5 and more on daily game drives and guided bush walks. Days are about adventure and game drives & bush walks are led by experienced rangers and guides.






DAY 8: Kruger Region to Hazyview

Venture along the Panorama Route visiting various sites along the way; Three Rondavels-Blyde, Bourke's Luck Potholes, God's Window, a breathtaking natural rock formation that allows for spectacular views

of the Lowveld and the ravine directly below. From the vantage of the viewpoint, the cliffs plunge more than 700m to lush indigenous forest below. Situated just outside of Hazyview, between the Drakensberg Mountains to the west and the low-lying bushveld of the Greater Kruger Area to the east, on the banks of the Sabie River we reach our overnight accommodation. After traversing the countryside and African bush on game drives, it's time to knock the dust off! Relax, unwind and watch as hippo, crocodile and other wildlife congregate at the river.

DAY 9: Hazyview to Livingstone

This morning transfer to the airport for our scheduled internal flight to Livingstone. Our lodge for the next two nights is situated on the lush banks of the Zambezi River, seamlessly blending into its surroundings. Enjoy the same breathtaking views that once captivated David Livingstone, the pioneering explorer and missionary who was the first European to lay eyes on the Falls. Furthermore, the lodge is located within the tranquil Mosi-Oa-Tunya National Park, providing the perfect setting for a spa experience that complements your Victoria Falls adventure.

DAY 10: Livingstone

Experience a walking and driving tour of historic Livingstone led by a local guide steeped in the history and legends of the town. Soak in the atmosphere of the High

Court, the legendary North-Western Hotel, library, sports club and churches. The entire town was relocated by the British South Africa company from its original setting on the river to its current location on the hillside, and in 1907 it became the capital of what was then Northern Rhodesia. This evening, sit back and relax on a sunset cruise, what better way to celebrate the end of the day with a spectacular sunset on the Zambezi River with good friends! Drift along the river enjoying the abundant wildlife that gathers along the banks of the Zambezi River. Watch for hippos, crocodile and some good birdlife. Possible other game sightings are elephant, giraffe, buffalo and antelope. An experienced guide is on board to enhance your knowledge of the wildlife and local history of the area.

DAY 11: Livingstone to Victoria Falls

Travel to the majestic Victoria Falls, to experience an awe-inspiring guided tour of the Falls and encompassing nature reserves. No surprise why Victoria Falls is one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. You'll understand it instantly as we tour through the Zimbabwean side. There are numerous spectacular vantage points along the width of the Falls, and the sight of this astounding gift of nature, simply takes your breath away. Walk through the permanent, beautifully misty rain forest which flanks the Falls, stopping to marvel at the principal sites as it cascades to the depths below the Main Falls, Horseshoe Falls, Rainbow Falls, the Boiling Pot, Cataract Island and Livingstone Island. We'll stand and watch, feel and listen to the spray and thunderous noise, as millions of litres of water tumble over the Falls into a series of narrow gorges below. The seventh Natural Wonder of the World puts on the most dramatic show!

DAY 12: Victoria Falls

Today is yours to explore as much or as little as you wish. The hotel is ideally located in the hustle and bustle of town, within walking distance of many historical sites, restaurants and activities. You might choose to view the spectacular Victoria Falls with an exhilarating helicopter ride. Explore the lush wilderness surrounding the town on a game drive. For the thrill seekers, surf the rapids on a Zambezi River white-water rafting

expedition, get your heart racing and bungee jump off the Victoria Falls Bridge, or view the Falls from the exhilarating angle of Devil's Pools on the edge of the plunging water. Enjoy the evening at a Boma Dinner & Drum Show, a must do Victoria Falls dining and entertainment experience, specializing in traditional African food, drumming and dancing. The menu comprises a range of traditional Zimbabwean dishes complemented by a BBQ buffet. Look forward to an energizing evening of drumming, traditional song and dance, along with a storyteller adding that extra element of intrigue and drama to the evening.

DAY 13: Victoria Falls to Kasane

Travel from Victoria Falls to Kasane, Botswana for two nights. The lodge overlooking the Chobe River is located adjacent to Botswana's game-rich Chobe National Park, offering a magical game experience. Expect to view the largest concentration of elephant in Africa as well as herds of buffalo, lion and leopard and much more! You can look forward to cruises down the Chobe River and game drives.

DAY 14: Kasane

More game drives and river cruises today! Make sure you leave time to soak up a sunset overlooking the Chobe River by grabbing a stool at the bar that overlooks an island it's named for – Sedudu. Ask your guides about who owns the island for an interesting tale! With gorgeous views across the Chobe River, it's the finest sundowner spot in Kasane! Reveling in the breathtaking sun-drenched sky at sunset is a perfect end to your Botswana Safari.

DAY 15: Kasane to Cape Town, SA

Taking the amazing experiences of Chobe National Park with you, transfer to the airport for your flight to Cape Town. Awarded 'Best Destination in Africa' for four consecutive years, Cape Town is at the top of every bucket list, and one of the most sought-after destinations in the world. Spend the next four nights ideally situated, within walking distance of Cape Town's culturally rich inner city, at the entrance to the magnificent V&A Waterfront, with its world-class shops, restaurants, hotels and diverse entertainment options.

DAY 16: Cape Town

There could be no better way to spend a day than indulging in a Cape Winelands experience packed with historic and modern architecture, fabulous cuisine, and, of course, world-class wines. South Africa is well-known for its quality white, reds, blends, and bubbies. Traversing stunning landscapes through the country's principal wine routes of Paarl, Stellenbosch and Franschhoek – all of them with fascinating histories and unique offerings. This full-day experience will have you traversing stunning landscapes, with wonderful stops along the way for wine tasting.

DAY 17: Cape Town

This morning board the ferry (weather permitting) over to Robben Island for a guided tour including a viewing of Nelson Mandela’s cell. In the afternoon take a trip to the top of the world, high above the clouds on the famous Table Mountain (weather permitting). Step into the rich history of this city passing key historical monuments and places of interest.

DAY 18: Cape Town

Enjoy a different part of the “Mother City” with a Cape Peninsula Guided Tour. With exciting stops at; Hout Bay Harbour, Chapman’s Peak (weather permitting), Cape of Good Hope, Cape Point Nature Reserve, Flying Dutchman Funicular, Boulders Beach – home of the endangered land-base colony of African penguins. Tonight’s Farewell Dinner will take you on a taste safari paired with traditional Mali puppets and entertainment.

DAY 19: Cape Town to Home Cities

After free time this morning head out to explore the diverse beauty of Kirstenbosch National Botanical Garden. The first botanical garden in the world to be declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, nestled at the eastern foot of Cape Town’s iconic Table Mountain. Stroll down meandering paths that explore the meticulously crafted and maintained flora, containing many examples of fynbos or “Cape Flora”. This plant exists as a huge part of the Cape Floral Kingdom and is unique to this part of the world. Tired of walking beneath the boughs and leaves, you can always relax on the lawns and

indulge in a picnic of wine and cheese. There are also two restaurants and a shop to explore, with an indigenous nursery and a sculpture garden. Finally, the Boomslang is an amazing canopy walkway which provides visitors with brilliant vistas of the surrounding nature. After your time at Kirstenbosch, depart for the airport and your return flight home.
